CREATE AN IRS ONLINE ACCOUNT

Before you start, you will need the following:

- Cell phone or computer
 - With access to text/phone/email to setup multi-factor authentication (MFA)
 - With access to a camera for identity verification
- License, state ID, passport, or a passport card


STEP 3: Click the "Create an account" selection, as seen below.




You may be asked to confirm your email address during this step. A verification link/code will be sent to your email. Please click the "confirm email" box or copy the code and enter it in the account verification screen.

STEP 5: Read the prompt and click "Continue", as seen below.





STEP 7: Verify your identity using one of the following methods, below.




It's important to ensure that the identification provided is legible. To avoid issues with verification, please make sure the ID is valid, you have proper lighting, and you follow the instructions the IRS provides in the walkthrough.
